The Service

Music: It is normal to have 3 hymns but you can have more or fewer. For information and advice on what hymns, music and readings to have, please ask us or visit the Church of England wedding site, https://www.yourchurchwedding.org

Three further pieces of music need to be chosen: for entry of the bride, the signing of the register, and the exit of the couple at the end. The organist can play these if in their repertoire, or you can provide your own musicians or use the church CD player. Please note these play conventional CDs only, not computer files.

Readings: A Bible reading should be included but you are welcome to have other readings too, e.g. a poem. A selection of suitable readings will be discussed with the vicar at a preparation session so feel free to ask for advice. Choice of vows: Most people today use the modern service, officially known as 'common worship'. Older versions of the service are still legal, but please note that they have notions of marriage that may sound strange to the modern ear. Please note that if the modern service is used the bride has the option of varying the line 'to love and to cherish' to 'to love, cherish and obey.' Rings: The giving of rings is an important part of the service. They are a symbol and reminder of the promises you are making to each other. You can either have one ring (given to the Bride by the groom), or each give and receive a ring.

General Information

Confetti may be thrown in the churchyard provided it is biodegradable.

Flowers and other decorations may be put in church on the morning of the wedding or the day beforehand if the church is free- please check this with the administrator.

Bells: In Gobowen a set of bells is chimed by a single ringer. In Selattyn there is a set of individually rung bells. However, we do not have our own team of bell ringers. All are based at other churches. There is therefore no guarantee that they will be available for your wedding. If they are unavailable, then a tape recording of bells projected by loudspeaker from the tower can be played on your entry and exit from church free of charge.

Photography and videos: Your service may be photographed or videoed but they must be as discreet and unobtrusive as possible. Wedding guests must refrain from flash photography during the service. Please may the photographer make contact with the clergy before the service.

Parking: In Gobowen the small field belonging to the church next to the church hall may be used for parking by guests. The churchyard can be used for the bridal/bridesmaids' cars and guests who have a disability or suffer serious difficulties in walking. Selattyn owns no parking land. Please use the public roads. Please note that parking in the Cross Keys pub car park is not permitted unless the landlord has given you explicit permission.

Service Booklets

There is no requirement to produce service booklets but some couples like to produce them as a souvenir for guests. The service can work well without them and most hymns are available in the church hymnbooks. Please check if your hymns are in the books with the administrator before confirming your hymns if you are not having a booklet printed.

If you are producing your own separate order of service for guests to take away as a souvenir, it should follow the following template:

Preface & The Declarations

The minister says to the congregation

First, I am required to ask anyone present who knows a reason why these persons may not lawfully marry, to declare it now.

The minister says to the couple

The vows you are about to take are to be made in the presence of God, who is judge of all and knows all the secrets of our hearts; therefore if either of you knows a reason why you may not lawfully marry, you must declare it now.

The minister says to the bridegroom

N, will you take N to be your wife? Will you love her, comfort her, honour and protect her, and, forsaking all others, be faithful to her as long as you both shall live?

He answers

I will.

The minister says to the bride

N, will you take N to be your husband? Will you love him, comfort him, honour and protect him, and, forsaking all others, be faithful to him as long as you both shall live?

She answers

I will.

The minister says to the congregation

Will you, the families and friends of N and N, support and uphold them in their marriage now and in the years to come? All: We will.

The bride and bridegroom face each other. The bridegroom takes the bride's right hand in his.

I, N, take you, N, to be my wife, to have and to hold from this day forward; for better, for worse, for richer, for poorer, in sickness and in health, to love and to cherish, till death us do part; according to God's holy law. In the presence of God I make this vow.

They loose hands.

The bride takes the bridegroom's right hand in hers, and says

I, N, take you, N, to be my husband, to have and to hold from this day forward;
for better, for worse,
for richer, for poorer,
in sickness and in health,
to love and to cherish,
till death us do part;
according to God's holy law.
In the presence of God I make this vow.

They loose hands.

The Giving of Rings

The bridegroom places the ring on the fourth finger of the bride's left hand and, holding it there, says

N, I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage. With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

If rings are exchanged, they loose hands and the bride places a ring on the fourth finger of the bridegroom's left hand and, holding it there, says

N, I give you this ring as a sign of our marriage. With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

If only one ring is used, before they loose hands the bride says

N, I receive this ring as a sign of our marriage. With my body I honour you, all that I am I give to you, and all that I have I share with you, within the love of God, Father, Son and Holy Spirit.

Genesis 1:26-28

⁴Love is patient, love is kind. It does not envy, it does not boast, it is not proud. ⁵It is not rude, it is not self-seeking, it is not easily angered, it keeps no record of wrongs. ⁶Love does not delight in evil but rejoices with the truth. ⁷It always protects, always trusts, always hopes, always perseveres.

(⁸Love never fails. But where there are prophecies, they will cease; where there are tongues, they will be stilled; where there is knowledge, it will pass away. ⁹For we know in part and we prophesy in part, ¹⁰but when perfection comes, the imperfect disappears. ¹¹When I was a child, I talked like a child, I thought like a child, I reasoned like a child. When I became a man, I put childish ways behind me. ¹²Now we see but a poor reflection as in a mirror; then we shall see face to face. Now I know in part; then I shall know fully, even as I am fully known.

¹³And now these three remain: faith, hope and love. But the greatest of these is love.)

Ephesians 3:14-end

¹⁴For this reason I kneel before the Father, ¹⁵from whom his whole family in heaven and on earth derives its name. ¹⁶I pray that out of his glorious riches he may strengthen you with power through his Spirit in your inner being, ¹⁷so that Christ may dwell in your hearts through faith. And I pray that you, being rooted and established in love, ¹⁸may have power, together with all the saints, to grasp how wide and long and high and deep is the love of Christ, ¹⁹and to know this love that surpasses knowledge—that you may be filled to the measure of all the fullness of God.

²¹Submit to one another out of reverence for Christ. ²²Wives, submit to your husbands as to the Lord. ²³For the husband is the head of the wife as Christ is the head of the church, his body, of which he is the Saviour. ²⁴Now as the church submits to Christ, so also wives should submit to their husbands in everything.

²⁵Husbands, love your wives, just as Christ loved the church and gave himself up for her ²⁶to make her holy, cleansing^[b] her by the washing with water through the word, ²⁷and to present her to himself as a radiant church, without stain or wrinkle or any other blemish, but holy and blameless. ²⁸In this same way, husbands ought to love their wives as their own bodies.
